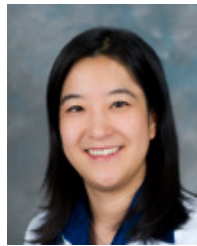


MEET OUR RETINA SERVICES TEAM

Patient care philosophy: I aim to provide excellent care for my patients by educating my patients so that they have a clear understanding of their condition and treatment options.

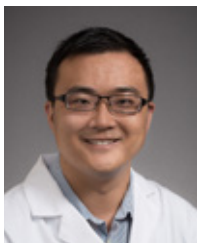


JAMES L. KINYOUN, M.D.

UW assistant professor of ophthalmology and attending physician

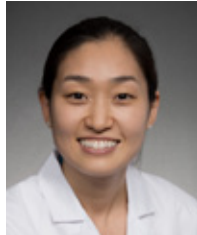
Scope of care: medical and surgical care for vitreoretinal and macular diseases

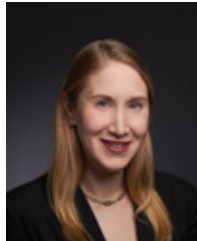


CECILIA LEE, M.D., M.S., M.P.H.

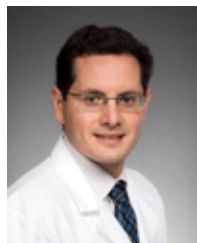


KATHRYN PEPPLER, M.D., Ph.D.

Patient care philosophy: My goal is to prevent vision loss and blindness by providing high quality clinical care and developing new treatments for patients with uveitis.

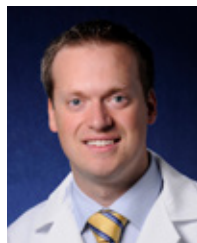


KASRA REZAEI, M.D.
